



WAYFINDER 38

The Wayfinder 38 is the inaugural model from Aiata, a new shipyard under the umbrella of the Turkish conglomerate Anadolu Group, that exemplifies a platform for customization and flexibility, as well-rounded as it is versatile. The boat lines and aesthetics are pinned by Finnish designer Jarkko Jämsén, whose expertise in naval architecture and industrial design has significantly influenced modern yacht aesthetics.

The length of the Wayfinder 38 is the only constant; everything else is open-ended, readily adapting to warm and cold climates, calm and choppy seas, veterans and beginners, relaxing and adventurous trips, long and short stays on board, and many other dichotomies in yachting that typically constitute compromises for owners. Ease of operation is a priority on and off the water, with thoughtful, handy considerations found on board, from layout design to the latches and fastenings. This philosophy also applies to the reconfiguration process, which takes just few hours to toggle some of the most important options for the Wayfinder 38. For example, an owner can catch fish with friends in the North Sea one weekend, relying on the warmth of a closed cabin and the support of a professional fishing module, and grill those fish with family on the Mediterranean the very next weekend, enjoying an open cabin with the full length of the deck dedicated to socializing and relaxation. Many of the options available for the Wayfinder 38, which can be browsed and viewed on the website's live-updating virtual configurator, can be changed at will after delivery. There are even important elements that can be configured during the course of an outing, from the furnishings to the layout itself. In a size range where portability is a major advantage, the Wayfinder 38 is designed to thrive in a wide variety of conditions around the world.

Designed to mount twin outboard engines, the Wayfinder 38 is available with four power choices: the 350hp Honda V8, 300hp Mercury V8, 350hp Mercury V8, and 400hp Mercury V10, offering top speeds between 49 and 57 knots. Tracks in the deck allow the stern unit to shift forward, making way to lift the propellers out of the water and maintain the engines. One option for the centerpiece is a large folding table that opens to accommodate eight guests for meals and provides eight cupholders for refreshments with more room to move around when closed, sandwiched between counter-facing sofas to the fore and aft. An option for the aft sofa hides a large wet bar with refrigeration (90 lt), a grill, and storage, while the forward sofa has a reversible backrest in case guests prefer to stay in the cabin, completing the U-shaped interior sofa. It is also possible to have a specialized, fishing-focused bar with rod sockets. For ultimate simplicity, a fixed sofa is also available for the stern.

If the owner chooses the Suntop version, an electric awning is available to extend over the entire stern, while the aft window of the Cabin version can open like a hatch to cover the cockpit with a transparent roof. The closed cabin also opens on both sides through sliding glass doors with the option of an opening sunroof as well. Instead of the sunroof, with its electrically controlled weather-proof canvas cover, it is possible to have four solar panels totaling 390W/hr maximum output. The cabin is spacious enough to host a full complement of guests around a deployable table, with a gas cooker and microwave-equipped galley module at hand. The standard seat for the pilot and copilot also features a



reversible backrest, so it can complete the forward section of the interior seating, The lateral section of the interior seating is also optional and can be easily removed or replaced based on the number of guests.

Bow Bulwark Rod Holders and Rocket Launchers on the hard top complete the array of fishing infrastructure, which can be equipped to span the length of the Wayfinder 38 from stern to bow for intensive expeditions. The aft-facing sofa on the bow can be joined by two lateral extensions, perfectly situated to surround the deployable table. In front of the windscreen, there is a volume that raises the ceiling above the bed, allows for skylights and natural air, also it provides a cushion for leaning back while cruising or relaxing by the bow table. Built on hinges, this volume can open like a hatch to facilitate the transfer of large objects down onto the spacious lower deck, offering exceptional utility and convenience. When hosting and comfort are prioritized, the opening functionality can be traded for an additional sofa on the bow lounge, which faces forward and completes the seating around the table.

Subtle considerations testify to the brand's commitment, such as the fender pins that become plug and play after tying them off just once, the perfectly placed handrails, grip surfaces, and steps, and the use of solid teak and oak, which adds warmth to the neutral palette. The exterior fabrics are available in Overcast Gray and Atlantic Blue, complementing the wooden accents and Flexiteak or Anti-Skid decking options. Down the stairs beside the helm, the interiors are bright and cozy, regardless of the selected upholstery color of Carbon Beige or Graumel Chalk, with light pouring in through the bow windows. Storage is plentiful, with the cabinetry in teak or oak providing ample drawers, shelves, trays, and other spaces adapted to the personal effects required at sea. The bathroom features a head, shower and sink, closed by a door from the bedroom, which centers on a queen-sized bed.
